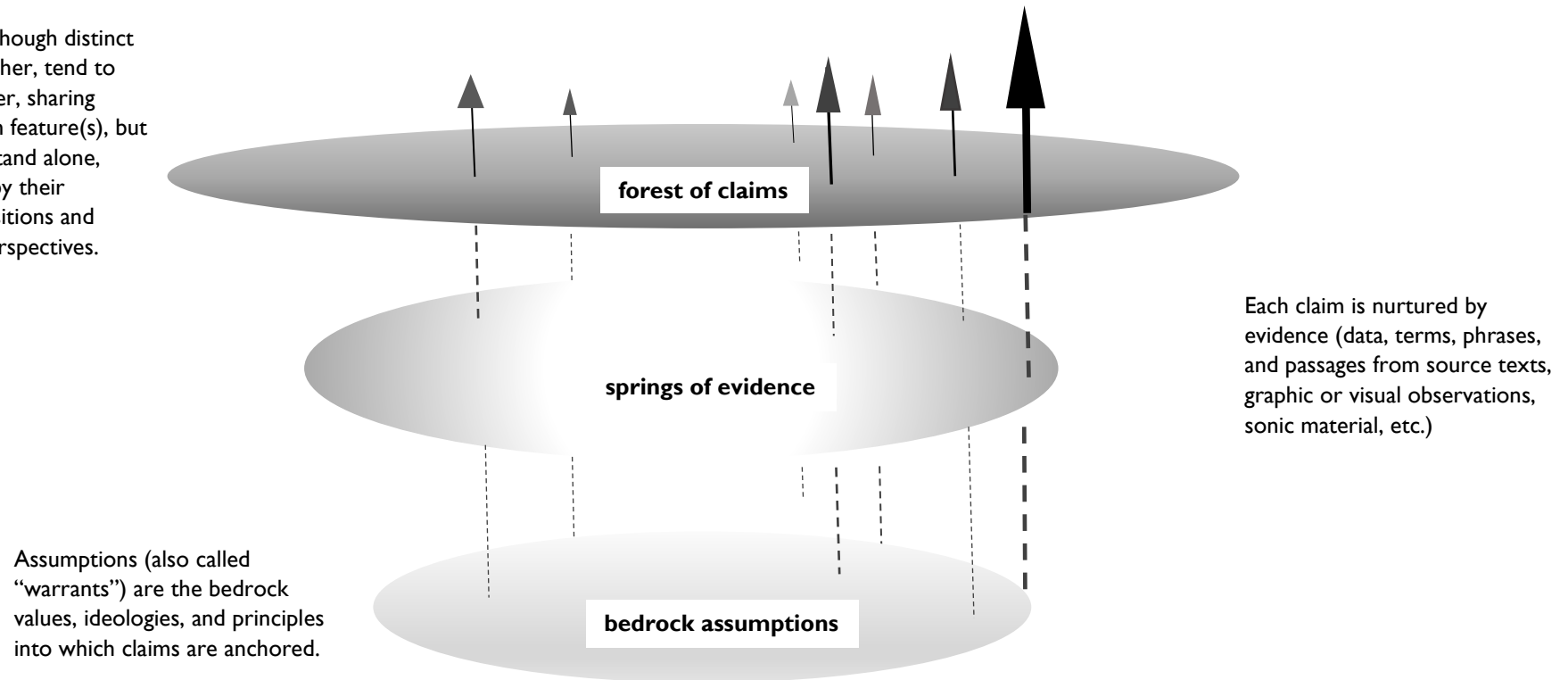


## mapping the territory of a disagreement.

Some claims, though distinct from one another, tend to cluster together, sharing some common feature(s), but other claims stand alone, distinguished by their competing positions and contrasting perspectives.



1. Identify, differentiate, and map competing claims in order to populate the territory of a disagreement.
2. Locate the evidence (data, terms, phrases, passages, dialogue, visual forms or sonic material) that is used to support each claim.
3. Discover the foundational assumptions (invisible from the surface, but deeply taken for granted) upon which claims rest.
